Boarding catteries will almost certainly require this before accepting your cat.

Don't forget to get it updated at annual booster time.

- ***Your record of vaccination is an important document. Please keep it in a safe place.***
- ***Ring the Surgery if your cat appears unwell—you could save its life.***

What diseases are covered by our vaccination?

1. Feline Panleucopaenia
2. Feline Herpesvirus (*cat 'flu*)
3. Feline Calicivirus (*cat 'flu*)
4. Chlamydomphila felis (*cat 'flu and chronic conjunctivitis*)
5. Feline Leukaemia Virus (FeLV)

Also available additional to the standard vaccination package are:

1. The above vaccine package without the FeLV component. This is slightly cheaper but we feel the full package is far safer for your cat and far better value.
2. Rabies. This is required for the *Pet Travel Scheme* if you intend travelling abroad. Please ask at the Surgery for details of this.

When should I vaccinate my cat?

Kittens may start their vaccination course as early as nine weeks of age. If your kitten is younger than this when you purchase it then take advantage of our **free kitten check** and bring him or her in to register them and have a pre-vaccination full health check.

Obviously if you acquire an older kitten or adult cat it is advisable to start their vaccination course straight away.

The primary vaccination course consists of two injections with the second vaccination at not less than twelve weeks old and a gap of 3 weeks since the first. Remember that the protective effects of vaccination are not complete until one week after the second injection.

The protection provided by the vaccination gradually falls, leaving your cat at risk. **Regular annual boosters are therefore vital to maintain the immunity your cat needs.** This annual visit to the Surgery provides an opportunity for us to give your pet a routine health check at the same time.

To help you remember you will be notified by post when your pets annual booster and health check is due.
